We use the SHS for research and policy development in regards to racial equality in Scotland. On the subjects in which data is disaggregated by ethnicity, we use the given to compare the experiences of minority ethnic individuals to white ethnic individuals.

Most recently, we have used data from the SHS in the development of the Scottish Government's Race Equality Framework for Scotland 2016-2030 and, in particular, in our research and policy development around community cohesion and safety (e.g. experiences of discrimination and harassment and feeling of community belonging).

We would greatly value the opportunity to use more data from the SHS, were more data and topics to be disaggregated by ethnicity.

For our organisation, the impact would simply be that data on household composition and discrimination/harassment and belonging would be updated on a biennial rather than annual basis.

The impact of this option has the potential to be greater for our organisation. As the minority ethnic population of Scotland is relatively small, we are concerned that reducing sample size may mean that the voices of diverse minority ethnic communities would be compromised. Detailed analysis of household composition for each ethnic group may be difficult to achieve with a smaller sample size, which would have a negative impact on our work.

As above, since we deal with data relating specifically to minority ethnic communities, a smaller sample size would compromise detailed analysis for household composition to potentially leave out some smaller communities from the survey.
